Demolition analysis 2014: Since the beginning of 2014, a total of 311 Palestinian owned structures (112 residential and 199 livelihood) were demolished in all of the West Bank, including East Jerusalem. 23 percent of the structures demolished thus far in 2014 were donor funded (see below chart for breakdown by month.) 10 percent of demolitions in 2014 have occurred in East Jerusalem, whereas 59 percent of demolitions in 2014 have occurred in the Jordan Valley.

Displacement from demolition analysis 2014: As a result of the 311 demolitions in 2014, 629 persons were displaced, 53 percent of whom are children. 57 percent of the displacement from demolition in 2014 occurred in the Jordan Valley, whereas 16 percent of the displacement from demolition occurred in East Jerusalem.

Annual comparisons: There is a 13 percent rise in demolitions and a 33 percent rise in people displaced by demolition when comparing Jan-May 2013 to Jan-May 2014 (there were a total of 275 demolitions

between Jan-May 2013 which displaced a total of 472 people as compared to 311 demolitions displacing 629 people between Jan-May 2014.)

Monthly comparisons: There is a 7 percent rise in demolitions and a 80 percent rise in people displaced by demolitions when comparing May 2013 to May 2014 (there were 69 demolitions displacing 91 people in May 2013 as compared to 74 demolitions displacing 164 people in May 2014.)

Monthly trends: There was a trend of mass or targeted demolition in May 2014, with 55 structures demolished in 5 incidents in 3 locations, displacing 142 people in total. These 5 incidents account for 74 percent of the monthly demolitions and 87 percent of the monthly displacement in May. There was also one additional incident this month in which a tent provided to a family in Jabal Al Baba in April was demolished, displacing the family of 5 again. This follows closely on trends from April 2014 where there were 56 structures demolished in 6 incidents in 4 locations, accounting for 61 percent of the monthly demolitions and 90 percent of the monthly displacement in April 2014.

Tell al Khashaba, 2 incidents, 11 structures demolished (8 donor funded) and 3 structures demolished (3 donor funded)

Khan al Ahmar Makeb As Samen, 2 incidents, 3 structures demolished (1 donor funded) and 2 structures demolished (2 donor funded)

Jiftlik Abu Ajaj, 1 incident, 36 structures demolished (0 donor funded)

April mass demolition incidents:

Al Jawana, 2 incidents, 13 structures demolished (9 donor funded) & 5 structures demolished (5 donor funded)

Humsa Al Buqai'a, 1 incident, 14 structures demolished (6 donor funded)

Jabal Al Baba, 2 incidents, 6 structures & 3 structures (3 donor funded)

Tell al Khashaba/Khirbet At Twayil, 1 incident, 17 structures demolished (2 donor funded)

In comparing 2012 to 2013 (71 to 298) there is a 320 percent increase in displacement from demolition in East Jerusalem as compared to a 53 percent increase in demolitions in East Jerusalem from 2012 to 2013. Part of the reason for this high number of displacement has to do with the types of buildings demolished in Jerusalem during 2013 (multiple family homes, apartment buildings, etc.) and the mass demolition of and transfer from the Bir Nabala/Tel Al Adassa Bedouin community (39 people).

Mass demolition

In 2013 four whole communities (Bir Nabala/Tel al Adassa, Az'zayem, Makhul, Ein Ayoub) were entirely demolished, leaving 189 people without homes or access to land

In the Jordan Valley community of Jiftlik, there were 11 incidents of demolition in 2013, with 28 structures demolished, displacing 93 people

In the Jordan Valley community of Hamamet Al Maleh, there were 5 incidents of demolition in 2013, with 89 structures demolished and 147 people displaced

In the East Jerusalem neighborhood of Beit Hanina, there were 9 incidents of demolition in 2013, with 10 structures demolished and 97 people displaced

2012 and 2013 Jordan Valley Analysis

Of the 663 demolitions in 2013, 390 occurred in the Jordan Valley (59 percent)

Of the 390 demolitions in the Jordan Valley in 2013, 117 (30 percent) occurred in 2 locations, Jiftlik and Hamamet Al Maleh

Updated 1 June 2014

Of the 604 demolitions in 2012, 172 occurred in the Jordan Valley (28 percent)

Comparing 2012 to 2013 (172 to 390) there is a 127 percent increase in demolitions in the Jordan Valley

Military trainings

There was a 76 percent increase in incidents of military trainings from 2012 to 2013, whereas the number of military trainings in the Jordan Valley doubled from 2012 to 2013. 92 percent of all the military trainings in 2013 took place in the Jordan Valley. The number of people temporarily displaced from military trainings increased 551 percent from 2012 to 2013. Military trainings occur despite there being no known hostilities in the West Bank and despite the ongoing peace process.

Demolition orders

Between 1988 and 2012, there were 12,230 demolition orders issued in Area C in the West Bank. An additional 340 orders were issued between January and April in 2013
